What does Bishop Chavasse School offer you and your child?

Bishop Chavasse CE Primary School is fortunate enough to benefit from being a new purpose-built building with constantly developing and evolving outside spaces for your child to learn in.

At our school we are proud to carry the name of Bishop Chavasse. We are named after a former Bishop of Rochester and one of the founding members of Bennett Memorial Diocesan School in Tunbridge Wells.

Christopher Chavasse was born in 1884 in Oxford. He was a keen athlete and competed in the 1908 summer Olympics in London. He later served as a chaplain in the British Army during the First World War. Christopher Chavasse was nominated to become Bishop of Rochester in March 1940 and was consecrated in April of the same year. He remained as the Bishop of Rochester until 1960. During this time, alongside Lady Bennett, he founded Bennett Memorial Diocesan School (our Tenax Trust secondary school) where his memory is held in high regard and his name is used as one of the House names for the school.



As a church school, we have close links with our local churches in Tonbridge and the children all have the opportunity to attend services. In addition, we gather together daily in school for a time of Collective Worship.

As a faith school, we have a number of families who worship regularly; we are an inclusive school and warmly welcome many children from families of Christian faith, and those of other faiths and those of none. Our inclusivity is what defines us: building strong foundations for all children to flourish and achieve excellence. We believe that happy children thrive and our values underpin all that we do.







What we offer you:

Outside we have:

- A forest school area where your child will take part in regular Outdoor Learning sessions;
- An outdoor classroom which can be used all year round;
- Three playgrounds one each for EYFS, KS1 and KS2;
- Large grassy areas with a trim trail;
- Full sized netball pitch for children to practice their ball skills;
- Spaces to run around in and also spaces to spend quiet outdoor time in.











Inside we have:

- Spacious classrooms along two easy to navigate corridors one for EYFS (Early Years Foundation Stage) and Key Stage 1, and one for Key Stage 2;
- Passionate, inspirational class teachers delivering high quality, personalised lessons every day;
- Teaching assistants who support the class teacher and deliver targeted interventions across year groups;
- A bright, spacious and well stocked library to borrow exciting books from;
- Quiet learning spaces outside the classrooms for personalised teaching;
- A dedicated room for music lessons;
- A room for Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Maths (STEAM);
- A fully equipped sensory room;
- Play therapist with a dedicated play therapy space;
- Daily Collective Worship where the school comes together to worship and reflect;
- A vertical House group system enabling your child to form friendships across the school;
- On site kitchen facilities providing your children with a choice of healthy, nutritious lunches every day;
- A variety of after school Enrichment clubs ranging from watercolour painting and gardening, to dodgeball and science;
- Targeted 'Early Bird' groups to support, challenge and extend learning before school;
- Daily breakfast club.







In addition we offer:

- Collective Worship run by staff from our link churches St Stephen's and St Peter and St Paul;
- Services for key festivals at our local church for the whole school to attend;
- A variety of in-school workshops to extend and support learning;
- Exciting school trips and excursions;
- Weekly swimming lessons for children timetabled in blocks across the school year;
- The opportunity to participate in academic, music, sporting and dance competitions;
- Extended wraparound care after school run by Newton Lang until
 6.30pm;
- On site play therapy, speech therapy and music lessons where required;
- 2 Walking buses to assist with school drop offs and to aid congestion on the roads.

We hope you will take advantage of all that we are able to offer your child at Bishop Chavasse and we are looking forward to welcoming you to our community and getting to know you.



In year transfers - your new school day

First Day

We want to do everything we can to make your move to our school as happy as possible - we know it can feel daunting. We will tell you your new class and the name of your new teacher before you start and ensure your class teacher is at the office reception to welcome you on your first day. We will have a buddy for you from your new class, who will help you find your way around and make settling in fun and easy.

When you arrive for your first day, please come to the office reception at 8.45am. Your new class teacher will meet you and take you to your new classroom. This means you avoid the busy school gate while you find your way around.

Our school day starts at 8.55am and finishes at 3.15pm. Registers close at 9.10am. All parents are asked to complete a pick up form to indicate which adults usually collect on which day to ensure safety for all the children.

A member of staff will dismiss your child to you. Written permission can be given to KS2 children to walk around to KS1 to meet parents who are collecting KS1 children. We also encourage children in Years 5 and 6 to walk home independently where possible. Written permission is required.

Enrichment Clubs, Breakfast Club and After School Wrap-Around Care

Bishop Chavasse Primary School provides excellent pastoral care and Enrichment opportunities. These range from a variety of clubs such as chess, art, dance, construction, nature, golf, dodgeball and football. Enrichment clubs run from 3.15pm to 4.30pm daily.



The school also runs a wraparound provision which includes a popular daily breakfast club from 7.30am (please drop your child off at the school hall) and afterschool Enrichment clubs until 4.30pm. These provisions need to be booked and paid for via the school booking system. Places are limited and so are offered on a first come, first serve basis via our online booking system Arbor. The booking window opens two weeks before the end of the preceding term. All our clubs are set out on the website: Breakfast Club, Enrichment and After School Clubs. Children in Early Years are invited to take part in a special enrichment club just for them during the first term while they settle

EYFS and KS1 children attending an afterschool Enrichment club should be collected from the school library, through the KS1 gate and KS2 children from the school hall at 4.30pm promptly. A member of staff will always dismiss your child to you.

Additional wraparound care is provided by an external provider **Newton** Lang who offer childcare from 4.30pm - 6.30pm. Leaflets can be picked up from the school office or you can contact them via email: Newton Lang Childcare newtonlangcc@gmail.com.



Once dismissed to their collecting adult, your child is their responsibility, even within school grounds.

Communications

We ensure that we keep our parents well informed on all that is going on at the school, as we know the importance communication has in ensuring a close home-school relationship.

We use an online system called Arbor for sending out communications, for the booking and payment of clubs, trips and parent consultations. When you join our school, you will be given instructions for logging on to the system by our office team. If you have any difficulties, please see the office team and they will be able to help you.

In order for us to work towards becoming a paperless school, we email newsletters and letters to keep you up to date. Class pages on the website are also updated each week with news relating to your child's school year or class and homework. Please ensure you check these regularly for notices and to find out what your child has been learning each week. Facebook - Bishop Chavasse Primary School - and Instagram are also excellent ways of seeing all the exciting things that go on during the school week.

On occasion, school staff may need to contact you during the day, if for example your child is unwell. It would be helpful to have at least three emergency contacts per child.

Please ensure the school is kept up to date with contacts. If you need to send someone different to collect your child, we will ask you to email a photograph of that person to the office for confirmation of identity.

If you need to speak to your class teacher/teaching assistant, they are usually available straight after school pick up. It is not always possible for teachers and TAs to be available at the start of the school day as they are preparing for your child's day. We believe strongly in a close partnership between home and school, so please do speak to your class teacher when you feel it necessary to discuss any concerns, or indeed, achievements - we love hearing about these too. In order to provide the highest level of care for your child and development of their learning, we ask you to support us fully and the ways in which you can do this effectively can be found in the enclosed home school agreement. Please read and keep in an accessible place at home.

If you would like to contact a member of staff, please speak to them at the gate at school pick up time, or alternatively please email the school office, and your message will be passed on to the relevant member of staff. We do not share staff's individual email addresses. Staff will endeavour to respond to emails within 48 hours. In case of an emergency, the DSL email is monitored for safeguarding concerns, but we recommend you contact the police in case of an emergency outside of school hours.

Your new school uniform









We have a smart but simple school uniform, which the children wear with pride; just as we have high expectations of pupil conduct, we have high expectations that children wear their school uniform and look smart and ready to learn.

EYFS uniform

In EYFS, we recognise that many children will have just mastered getting themselves dressed. Therefore, the uniform in EYFS only is as follows:

- Royal blue, school sweatshirt or cardigan with the school logo;
- White polo shirt, these can be purchased with the school logo or may be plain white. It is useful to have at least a couple with logos as we ask for these to be worn for easy identification on school trips;
- Grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore: where possible, please purchase with elasticated waists, rather than with a button or fastener, to support your child's development stages;
- Black sturdy shoes (velcro where possible as the children need to be able to take them on and off independently through the day);
- Mid blue and white full gingham summer dress or gingham playsuit (terms 1, 5 and 6 only);
- Black or grey socks, or black or grey tights in winter, and white socks with gingham dresses/playsuits in summer;
- School logo book bag and school logo PE bag;
- A school water bottle is provided.

PE:

- House coloured T-Shirt (with school logo). Parents will be informed of their child's House at the welcome evening;
- Black shorts;
- Plain black tracksuit (with or without the school logo) for the colder months;
- Sturdy trainers. No plimsolls;
- School PE bag with logo.



Year 1 - Year 6 uniform

- Royal blue, school sweatshirt or cardigan with the school logo;
- White shirt;
- School tie which can be tied (KS2) or pre-knotted with elastic (KS1). These can be purchased from the school office;
- Grey trousers, shorts or skirt;
- Mid blue and white full gingham summer dress or gingham playsuit (terms 1, 5 and 6 only);
- Black or grey socks, black or grey tights in winter, and white socks with gingham dresses/playsuits in summer;
- Sturdy plain black shoes.

PE:

- House coloured T-Shirt (with school logo): parents will be informed which House their child is in;
- Black shorts;
- Plain black tracksuit (with or without the school logo);
- Sturdy trainers no plimsolls;
- School PE bag with logo.



Optional:

- Blue school coat (reversible, waterproof, with logo).
- School backpack bag.
- School water bottle.

We require all EYFS/KS1 children to have the school book bag. We recommend KS2 children purchase a school rucksack. We ask that <u>ALL</u> items of school uniform are permanently named. This is to ensure that any lost property can be returned to its correct owner.

Jewellery, nail varnish and hair

Jewellery or nail varnish should not be worn to school. Students can wear one pair of studs; these have to be small, plain silver or plain gold. Students may wear a wristwatch, however smartwatches are not permitted. With the permission of the Headteacher, there may be exceptions for religious items, provided they are worn under a shirt. If earrings are unable to be removed these should be covered with micropore tape, which parents will need to provide. Any items worn into school are the child's responsibility.

All long hair - past shoulder length - must be tied back neatly with blue, white, black or hair coloured discrete bands and clips. This is for safety whilst learning and playing, to keep hair neat and out of children's eyes whilst they are working and to prevent the potential spread of headlice. Please save large bows and hairbands for outside school, weekends and holidays. This is for health and safety reasons.



Water Bottles

We encourage all children to drink water throughout the day. We will gift every new starter in EYFS a school water bottle on their first day at school. Children must only have water in their water bottle; no flavoured drinks or juice.



School Meals

We are fortunate to have our own school chef who cooks healthy, nutritious meals on site every day. All children, under the age of seven, are entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals. This means that they are able to have a free hot meal or sandwich each day, prepared from fresh ingredients by our caterers, Nourish.

All children in EYFS and KS1 have a school meal. They can choose between a hot meal or our sandwich option. We ask all parents to make sure that they notify us in writing of any allergies or dietary requirements your child may have. This may, for example, include if you would like your child to only have a vegetarian hot meal choice if they normally eat



halal meat (as halal meat is not provided by Nourish). We do not allow home packed lunches for these year groups unless there are extenuating circumstances. Please speak to us if you have any questions.

From Year 3, if you receive an income-based benefit, your child may still be entitled to Free School Meals, through the government scheme. Please see below for more information. If you would like to purchase a school meal for your child in Year 3 – Year 6 you are able to do this through Arbor.

Menus are available from the school office so that you can see the variety of healthy meals served each day, including a gluten free, dairy free and vegan menu. Please share the menu with your child and discuss the meal choices which they will then confirm every morning with their teacher at registration.

For those children in KS2 who choose to bring a packed lunch from home, we ask parents to provide a healthy and balanced lunch which will meet your child's nutritional requirements. Please do not include the following in your child's packed lunch: ring pull tins, cocktail or kebab sticks, sweets or chocolates. We are also a **NUT FREE** school and so ask parents to check packed lunch ingredients very carefully, to ensure the safety of all of our children. Nut products found in school will be removed.

Free School Meals and Pupil Premium

Although all EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 children will receive a Universal Free School Meal, if you are in receipt of an income-based benefit, your child may be eligible to receive Free School Meals throughout their time at our school. You will need to register for this at Free school meals - Kent County Council and, if in doubt, please contact the school office to discuss. In addition, to receiving free school meals, the school may also receive funding to support the pupils registered as pupil premium (PP) which will support their learning.

A child will also be registered as Pupil Premium if: they are, or have been, whilst in a primary school setting, entitled to



the Free School Meals provision (detailed above); they are a Looked After Child (LAC); they are a child adopted under the Adoption and Children Act 2002; they are a child who has left care under a Special Guardianship Order or Residence Order; they are in receipt of a child pension from the Ministry of Defence; they have a parent who is or has served in the Armed Forces.

Children who are in receipt of PP entitlement receive a free place (subject to allocated spaces), each term, at one of our after-school Enrichment Clubs. We encourage families to check their eligibility for Pupil Premium funding as soon as their child has started school.

Snack Time

Children in EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 receive a free piece of fruit or vegetable each day, usually at morning snack time, as part of the government's scheme. Children in these year groups may bring an additional piece of fruit in for the afternoon if they wish.

Children in KS2 are encouraged to bring a snack for break time: this must be a piece of fruit or chopped vegetable.

All children under the age of 5 and children entitled to Free School Meals will receive a free portion of milk, daily - provided by CoolMilk. When your child reaches their 5th birthday, they are able to still access



this provision; however, there will be a fee - this is partially subsidised by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA).

Absences

We all recognise the importance of attending school regularly in order that the children settle well and have the very best chance of being successful in school. We therefore ask that children attend school regularly and are on time. Attendance is closely monitored at Bishop Chavasse School.

If your child is too unwell to attend school, they need to be kept at home until they are well enough to return to school. However, we do ask that children who have a mild cold are sent to school as they often feel better as the school day progresses when they are engaged in their learning.

You are required to inform the school of absences prior to the start of the school day: please either telephone the school office on 01732 676040 or email the absence email absence@bishopchavasseschool.org.uk each day of your child's illness by 08:55am.

Kent Health Authority guidelines state that with a stomach bug a child must be free of sickness and/or diarrhoea for at least 48 hours before returning to school. Further details about exclusion periods for infectious illnesses are available from the school office, via the school website's <u>attendance policy</u> and from Public Health England. If you are in doubt as to whether your child is well enough to attend school, please contact the school office for advice.

Special Leave Request Forms are available from the office and these are required to be completed 2 weeks prior to when your child is expected to be absent from school, for any reason, other than illness. Permission must be obtained from the Headteacher through a Special Leave Request Form. Leave will only be granted in exceptional circumstances - this does not include family holidays, and you may be fined, by Kent County Council, for doing so.

Medicines

All prescribed medicines which children may need at school must be delivered personally to the school office and be in the original packaging, supplied by the dispensing chemist, and the name and dosage must be stated on the packaging. The medicine must be accompanied by a form signed by a parent giving permission and clear instructions for their administration (copies of this are available in the school office).

Asthma inhalers are kept in a first aid bag in the child's classroom which is always accessible. We will inform you if your child's inhaler has been administered during the school day. Kent

County Council Policy is to only administer antibiotics in school if the prescribed dose is a minimum of four times a day.

If your child has a more serious or long-term medical condition, please book an appointment with the SENDCO in order for an Individual Health Care Plan to be completed, so that we have all relevant details about medication and care of your child.

Walking Bus

In order to support those families who need to get to work, or are walking to school, we offer 2 daily walking bus services. One walking bus departs from Tudeley Lane near the Barnes Lodge care home entrance at 8.30am. The second walking bus departs from Hendy Ford at 8.20am until 8.30am, this runs as a 'drop and go' walking bus. The walking buses leave at 8.35am promptly. Three members of staff walk the children safely to school. In the event of adverse weather affecting school opening, the walking bus will not run. This is good for the environment, cutting down on car journeys, and reduces congestion in our school car park - and the children really enjoy it too!



Parking

We ask that parents, where possible, walk to school and indeed the children are encouraged to walk, scooter or cycle to school as part of their healthy lifestyle - we have bike/scooter racks on site. We do request that where parents need to drive to school they are considerate of our neighbours and do not park in Baker Lane. Reducing traffic around the school site makes it a much safer area for children and we appreciate parents' co-operation with this. We are very fortunate to be able to provide a limited number of car parking spaces, which are available at the beginning and end of the school day. However, we request that parents/carers do not park in the staff parking areas, or disabled bays, without displaying a badge. If you are a blue badge holder, please inform the office staff of this so that we are aware.

The car park turning circle is available for use at the start of the school day, in order to enable parents to drop their child off, where they will be greeted by a member of school staff. This is to be used when the child is happy to get out of the car independently and walk to their gated entrance. This is, however, not a parking zone.

We ask that all parents/carers driving their children to school stick to the **5mph** speed limit in the carpark so we are providing a safe



environment for the children before and after school. Please do not use mobile phones whilst driving on the school site.

Volunteering at BCS

We are always looking for willing volunteers to support our children in school with activities such as reading, creative curriculum, swimming supervision and also accompanying us on educational visits (both local and further afield). If you think you or your child's grandparents may be in a position to help in any of these areas, please email the office to enquire about volunteering at our school. We offer full training to those who would like to join our growing team of volunteers.

Security

All visitors to the school site must sign in at reception. Once signed in, visitors will be required to wear their lanyards and stickers, in order that Safeguarding procedures are adhered to. Please ensure that you read the Safeguarding information before entering the school site. Visitors are required to sign out when leaving the site.

PTA

Message from PTA

My name is Annemarie and I am the chair of the PTA (our Parents Teacher Association) here at Bishop Chavasse. I am a parent of three children here at Bishop Chavasse, and it is my absolute pleasure to welcome you and new children to our school community.

Things you may need to know

Each morning your adult will bring you through the KS1 gate and playground to the EYFS gate where your teachers or teaching assistants for the day will meet you between 8.45am and 8.55am. The teaching team will take you into class from there (for your first two weeks at school, your adult can walk you to your classroom door and say goodbye to you there).

Every day you will need to bring a coat (please try to learn to do up your coat by yourself), school water bottle and a school book bag (not rucksack). Please make sure all of these items are labelled clearly with your name. You can put one keyring on your book bag so that it is easy to recognise as yours. We will give you a school water bottle on your first day, and your adult can buy a book bag from our uniform suppliers. Please bring in a pair of wellies and a waterproof coat to keep at school – we go outside to play and learn in all weathers. You will also need a PE kit in a school PE bag.

Our uniform page in this pack or on the website tells you exactly what you need. All items of clothing and footwear should also have your name on and it is a good idea to practise changing from your uniform and into your PE kit before you start school as we do this once a week in Early Years.

Lunchtime and snack time

Each day you will have lunch in the hall. You will choose your lunch in the morning when we do the register. Your lunches are free and you can choose between a school packed lunch or a choice of three hot meals with a pudding. We go into the dining hall before the other classes when it is quieter. The teaching team will help you carry your trays and drinks if you need it. After you have eaten you will go outside into the EYFS playground where there are fun games to play with. In term 5, you start to play in the KS1 playground with the older children too. During the morning, you will be provided with a fruit or vegetable snack and some milk to drink while you are still 4 years old. Once you are 5 years old, your adults at home will need to sign up for you to have milk.

Collective Worship and House Groups

Everyone at school is part of a House group. You will earn coloured House points for showing positive behaviours and fantastic learning. At different times in the year, you will meet all the other children in the school who are in your house and take part in some fun activities together. Collective Worship is an important part of our school day. In Early Years, we join the whole school for worship on a Friday after Christmas where we celebrate everyone's learning and positive behaviour. For key festivals, we visit our local church for a service. We either meet at the church and walk back altogether or we walk to the church from school and are collected there.

 to bring in your own piece of fruit or vegetable for the afternoon you are
 allowed to do that.



• We provide a school pencil case with everything you need. If you would like to bring in a small pencil case with coloured pens and pencils that can stay in your bag until needed, that is allowed.

Forest School

At Bishop Chavasse Primary School we are fortunate to have a large, dedicated Forest School area and an accredited Forest School Leader. Our Forest School benefits from an outdoor shelter, campfire site, woodworking equipment, bug hotels, outdoor theatre and a mud kitchen. Forest School at Bishop Chavasse School allows more than just opportunities for children to develop their imaginations; it allows children chances to grow socially, emotionally, spiritually, physically, and intellectually. This in turn allows the children the opportunities to risk take and build up resilience helping them to grow as lifelong learners. At Bishop Chavasse we are very lucky to have a permanent shelter within the Forest School site - this allows us to always go outside regardless of the weather. Each year group will have set terms whereby they will have the chance to participate in all aspects of Forest School.



Trips

School trips are an integral part to children's learning and at Bishop Chavasse we aim for every child to be able take part in these experiences. We are lucky enough to have a team of staff that go above and beyond when coming up with trips (whether they are held internally or externally). Examples of trips that have taken place are: Kent Life, Brighton Aquarium, Hastings and Drusillas. Other experiences that have been held in school are the Wonderdome, Planetarium and the Rainforest workshop.

In the final year of school year 6 get the opportunity to go on a week long Residential trip to Heatree Centre in Devon. This is an exciting opportunity for our students to engage in outdoor education and team building activities and have invaluable learning experiences with a chance to develop their resilience, independence and social skills.
