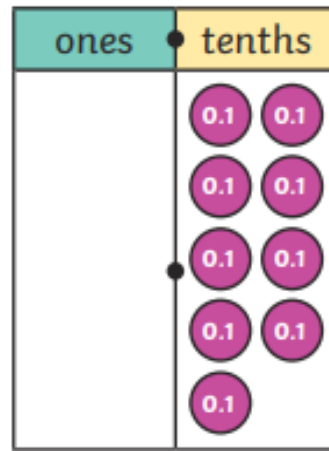


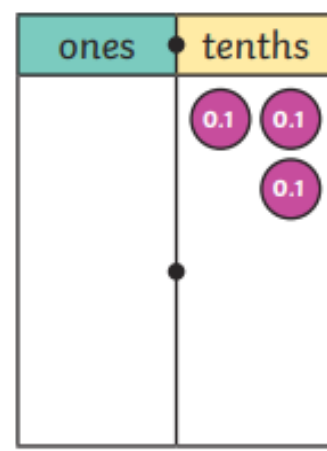

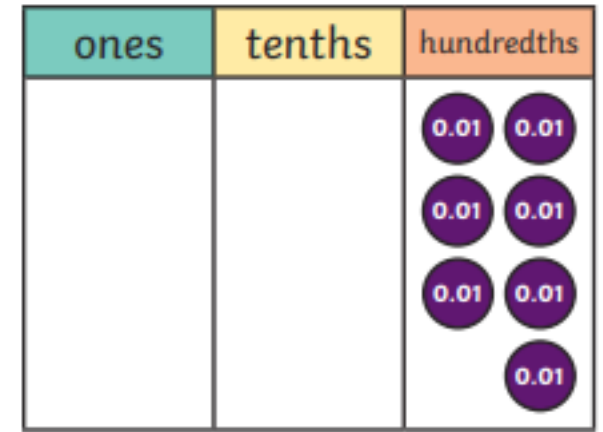

What Is Kindness?

Kindness is the sincere and voluntary use of your time, talent and resources to better the lives of others and the world through genuine acts of love, compassion and generosity. Why Is Kindness Important?
