Worship this week

'Those who listen to the word of God will grow to become wise, compassionate and honest.'

In worship this week, we have welcomed everyone back to school, introduced new staff and thought about our theological roots; how our school vision and values are deeply rooted in the parable of the Wise and Foolish Builder, Matthew 7:25. We also spent time reflecting on the small changes we can make at school each day to enable us to thrive even more, and how these small changes could change the path and fortune of our school year.

Keeping You Informed About Your Child

We know how important it is for parents and carers to feel informed about how their child is getting on at school. Your children spend a significant part of their week with us, and it is completely understandable that you want to know that they are happy, learning and making good progress. We have listened carefully to feedback from parents about communication about their child's learning and progress, and we have been reflecting on how we can make the information we already provide as useful and accessible as possible.

Each year, families have two individual parent consultations, where teachers share information about progress, attainment and learning behaviours, followed by a comprehensive written report in the summer. We also update class learning pages termly and offer Meet the Teacher, phonics sessions and English and Maths workshops to help families understand what and how children are learning.

Importantly, communication does not need to wait for these formal points. We have an open-door approach: parents can speak to teachers, email to arrange a conversation or request a meeting. Equally, if we have concerns about a child's learning, progress, behaviour or wellbeing, we will contact you rather than wait for a parents' evening. Our relationship with you is as important as the one we have with your children. We will continue to listen to your feedback and consider how we can make communication even clearer, while balancing this with protecting teachers' time to plan, assess and provide excellent learning for your children.

If there is something about your child's learning or progress that you would like to know, please ask us. **You never need to wait until the next parents' evening to have that conversation.** Ultimately, we share the same goal: for every child to be known, supported and helped to flourish, with families and school working together.
