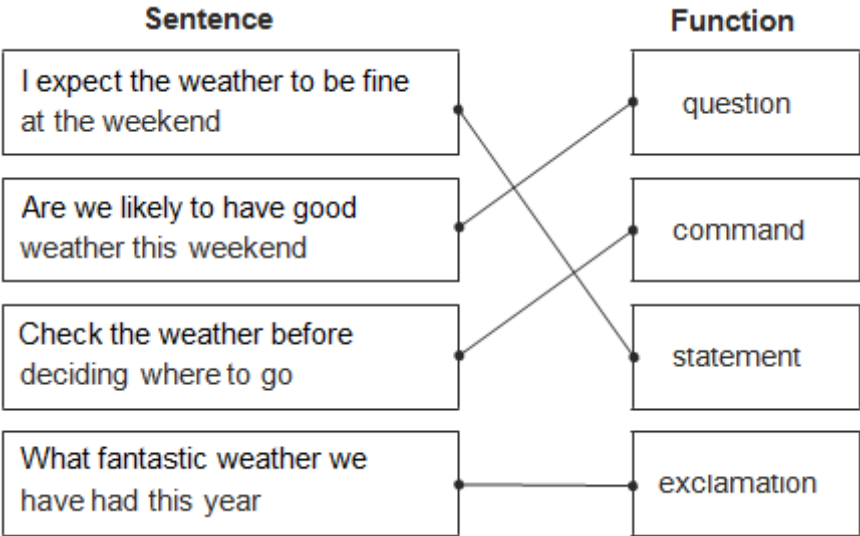

- Where... do you live?
- Where... is Mount Everest?
- Where... were my socks?

Do not accept responses where the question mark has been omitted.

Do not accept the use of a capital letter to start the response, eg:

- Where... Are the pens?
- Where... Have you gone?

Do not accept responses containing a grammatical error or non-standard form, eg:

- Where is you going on holiday?
