1. Use Hit the Button to practise the x7 and x8 tables. How many can you complete in one minute?
2. Can you find the factors and the factor pairs?

To find the factors of a number, you need to find all the pairs of numbers that multiply together to make a product.

For example: $1 \times 10 = 10$, $2 \times 5 = 10$. Therefore, 1, 2 and 5 are the factors. 10 is the product.

List the factors of these numbers. Be sure to be systematic in your approach:
